The four main drivers of public confidence are Community Engagement, Fair Treatment, Effectiveness of Policing and Alleviating Anti-Social Behaviour. This workshop shares the learning from this four year development, and the recent diagnostic case studies on boroughs to explore what activity improves public confidence.
